Luckily, Todai is surrounded by some of the best spots to enjoy viewing the autumn colors. Here is a list of three places in and out of Todai where the colors of autumn could be enjoyed.

First stop is just a stone's throw away from Building 1 - Todai's own Ginkgo-lined street. The leaves of the Ginkgo trees, the symbol of Todai, turn into bright, beautiful, golden yellow before falling to the ground. The scenery is so captivating that the street which runs from the main entrance gate to the Yasuda Hall turns into a small, lively park. Just one to two train stations away from Hongo Campus, one could enjoy the もみじ or the red Japanese maple trees in Koishikawa Korakuen Garden, a traditional Japanese garden constructed more than 380 years ago during the early Edo Period. It has a central pond, several hills from which you could enjoy a good view of the park, and some interesting bridges like the full moon bridge and the red, wooden bridge. You could visit the garden in the afternoon then head to the LaQua Mall in Korakuen to see the "dancing fountain" at night. The garden is just a few minutes' walk away from Korakuen or lidabashi station. The entrance fee is 300 yen but you might get a discount if you present your Todai ID. ⑤

Probably one of the best places to enjoy $\[\] \]$ in Tokyo, the Rikugien Garden is located near Komagome Station which is just two train stations away from Todaimae Station in the Namboku Line. Rikugien Garden is another traditional landscape Japanese garden constructed in the 1700's. It is famous for its autumn landscape which is especially illuminated during the last week of November to first week of December, the peak of the changing of colors of its trees. You will surely enjoy strolling around the garden while enjoying the watching the reflection of the illuminated trees in the pond. The magnificent display of lights on a cool, still night provides an almost magical atmosphere.
