

Japanese Language Class in Department of Civil Engineering provides for international students who will study Japanese along with their research activities and foreign spouses. Courses start in mid-April and mid-October (excluding short-term courses). Students interested in taking one of the courses need to apply during the designated application period before the courses start.



Each course uses a textbook, which matches with the level and meets five times a week, from Monday to Friday (2 hours each time, including time break in between). Normally, there are 10-15 students for each course. Therefore, all students have equal chance to practice Japanese in class and can improve their general Japanese abilities including reading, writing, speaking and listening very quickly.

One more important thing to choose Japanese class here is because of the teachers. We have different teachers every day. All of them are very friendly, helpful and highly qualified with excellent teaching skills, and of course, high-level English ability.
