Can introduce in short simple terms your hometown or other cities familiar to yourself to a person you had just met in Japan.

Can buy groceries and order food that it's related to your daily life.

Can talk to a university professor you meets in a school elevator, for example, in short simple terms about your recent news, daily life, experience and opinion.

Also can ask for permission such as "my stomach hurts"
"I have a fever, may I go back home?" etc. to a professor when you wants to absent from classes.

Can ask questions politely to the station employee, for example, about how to get to the destination, how to ride the train, etc., and understand a few simple answers to inquire for a lost thing.

Can read and write a basic kanji and understand everyday signs and notices: in public places, such as streets, restaurants, railway stations; in workplaces, such as directions, instructions, hazard warnings.
